



## **Halvergate Cricket Club**

### **Code Of Conduct**

- Regular players are expected to wear authorised Halvergate Cricket Club shirts and caps in all fixtures.
- Where appropriate captains may lay down a dress code to apply before and after matches (eg. Jackets/ties for specific games such as cup finals). In such cases, all players are expected to meet the required standards.
- The captains of each team are responsible, and accountable to the committee, for the behaviour of their players both during and after games, ensuring that those players are aware of this Code of Conduct, and play within both the letter and the spirit of the Laws of Cricket.
- The highest standards both on and off the field will be observed in keeping with the good name of Halvergate Cricket Club and the best sporting traditions of the game.
- Intimidation, aggressive behaviour and deliberate distraction of opponents are unacceptable.
- Foul or abusive language including “sledging” on or off the field is unacceptable.
- Dissent at umpiring decisions is unacceptable.
- Racially abusive comments or actions are unacceptable.
- Standards of behaviour both inside and outside the clubhouse at Halvergate or of opponents will be those expected in any other public place. Damage to, or interference with the property of club members, opponents, spectators or the club itself is unacceptable.

Nothing in the above Code of Conduct should be construed as limiting in any way the reasonable consumption of alcohol, natural exuberance, practical jokes, singing or other activities provided these do not have a detrimental impact on the enjoyment of other people.
